The above is **William T. Bidwell's** discharge paper signed by his captain, **Henry S. Graves**. After the war, Bidwell, formerly of Plattsburgh, went west and after several stops ended up in Redlands, CA. In 1892, he was appointed assistant superintendent of the County hospital there and Mrs. Bidwell was made matron. During the Civil War he had been a hospital steward. It looks like he continued his interest in medicine. He was still alive in 1932.

BIDWELL, WILLIAM T.—Age, 22 years. Enrolled, August 22, 1862, at Plattsburgh, to serve three years; mustered in as private, Co. H, August 26, 1862; promoted hospital steward, August 29, 1862; mustered in as second lieutenant, Co. E, May 22, 1865; mustered out with company, June 13, 1865, at Richmond, Va.

Commissioned second lieutenant, May 11, 1865, with rank from February 27, 1865, vice J. H. Calkins promoted.
