



Private Daniel C. Brown

Daniel C. Brown was 42 years old when he enlisted in Saranac on August 4, 1862. He was born in Montreal in March of 1818 and was the son of **John Brown** and **Olive Underwood**. John and Olive's gravestones can be seen in Keeseville. They may have come to New York from Sandisfield, MA. At the time of his enlistment, he was married, had children and was working as a teamster in Saranac. His children were **Charles W. Brown**; **Alvira Elizabeth Brown** who married three times 1. **Daniel Zones**, 2. **Lewis Chouinard** 3. **Simon Werner**; **Caroline Olive Brown** who married **William Jacobs** in Todd County, MN; and **Orrin L. Brown** who

married **Mary Jacobs** in Todd County in 1880.

Daniel was wounded and captured at Drury's Bluff and subsequently died in Andersonville Prison on September 1, 1864.

As you can see from the back of the "carte de visite", his daughter, Caroline, did not remember ever seeing her father and he never came back from the war. The family knew he starved to death with other prisoners in Andersonville, SC.

Daniel Brown - Sherman's grandfather on his mother's side. Mr. Brown was a soldier in the Civil War (enlisted when mother (Mrs. Edith Jacobs) was about 4 yrs. old, she doesn't remember ever seeing him. He never came back. Was captured, and starved to death in Andersonville prison in South Carolina.
