



Sgt. Edwin B. Bullis

In 1862 **Edwin B. Bullis** enlisted in the 118th NY Volunteers at Black Brook. He was a sergeant in 1864, when he was wounded in action at the Battle of Cold Harbor.

After the war, he returned to Black Brook and in 1870, he was working as a bloomer in a local iron operation. His wife was the former **Sarah Gaskell**, mother of his two daughters, **Elsy** (3) and **Amanda** (1). Edwin died in 1879 and is buried at the Evergreen Cemetery in Keeseville beside his wife and daughters.
