

Barnabe Gauthier, Civil War veteran, who had fought in the Battle of Gettysburg, and a well known and respected resident of Redford, NY, passed away at his home, on Wednesday afternoon, January 30th, 1924, after a lingering illness of almost two years. Mr. Gauthier was born in Redford, October 7, 1847, and spent most of the 77 years of his life there, or in its vicinity, where he was principally occupied in farming. He was also, for a number of years, the proprietor of the Redford Hotel, where the family still resides. Since the past year, his health was so impaired, that he was unable to do any work whatever. The funeral services were held from the R. C. Church on Saturday, February 2, Rev. Father Laramie officiating, then he was laid to rest in the vault until spring when his burial will take place.
