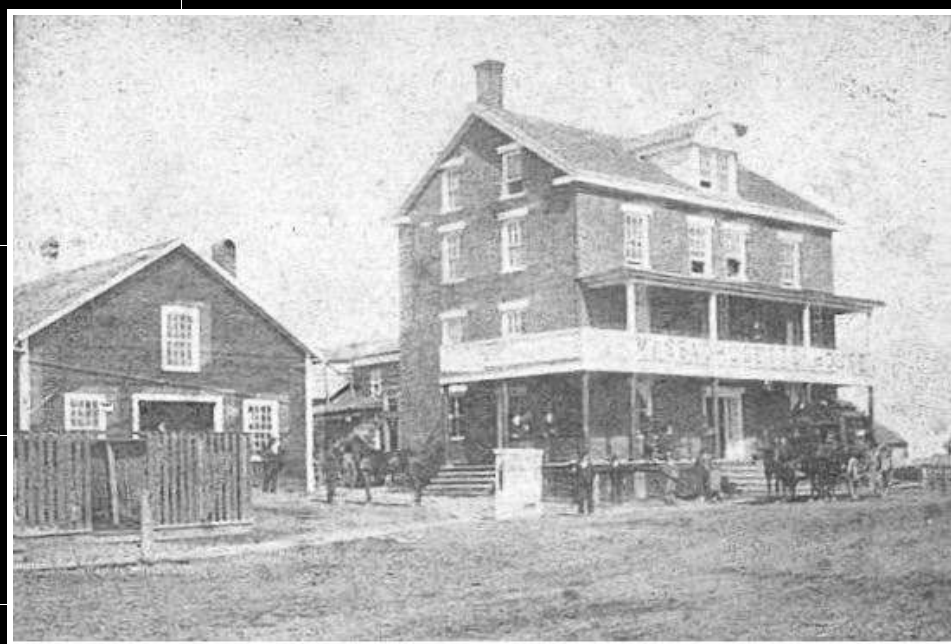


**Charles W. Rennell** died at his home in Rouses Point Wednesday, August 29<sup>th</sup> after an illness of several years. Mr. Rennell was in his 80<sup>th</sup> year and had been confined to the house for some time past with paralysis. He is survived

by his wife and two daughters, Mrs.

**George Boyd** and Mrs. **William Reynolds**, both of Albany, NY.

Mr. Rennell was born at Jay, Essex County, in December, 1848 and attended school in Jay and later in Keeseville. He enlisted in the Union Army when very young and served during the last two years of the Civil War and also fought the

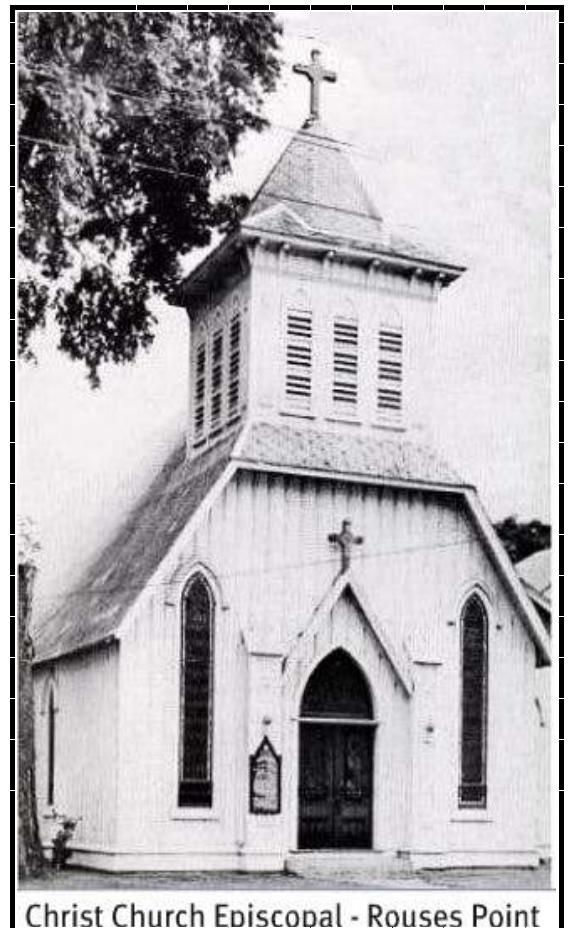


Massachusetts House - Rouses Point

Indians in the Sioux uprising. At the end of his enlistment, he opened a store in Keeseville. He married Miss **Lillie Mason** of Champlain on September 3, 1901.

Mr. Rennell was appointed to the U. S. Customs Service in Rouses Point in 1889 and served as Deputy Collector and Inspector for a number of years and was finally retired with a pension in 1920. He became the proprietor of the Massachusetts House in 1899. It was considered one of the finest hotels in the area. He was also connected with the Holland Hotel in Rouses Point.

Funeral services will be held at Christ Episcopal Church, Rouses Point, this afternoon at 2:30 and interment will be in Maple Hill cemetery.
