~ Hon. **Lemuel Stetson** and **Moss Kent Platt**, Esq., left town on Thursday of this week, November 26, for the battlefield of Antietam, to procure the remains of the late Lieut. Col. **John Lemuel Stetson** of the 59th NY Volunteers who was killed in that sanguinary engagement, and bring them to Plattsburgh for interment. He was 30 years old and the son of Lemuel Stetson. They are expected to reach here on or about the ninth of December. Notice will be given in the papers of next week as to the arrangements for the funeral. The officers and soldiers of the 59th NY Volunteers and also of the 16th NY Volunteers (with which regiment he was formerly connected), are especially invited to attend his funeral.

STETSON, JOHN L.—Age, 28 years. Enrolled at Washington, D. C., to serve three years, and mustered in as lieutenant-colonel, March 21, 1862; killed in action, September 17, 1862, at Antietam, Md.; prior service as captain, Sixteenth Infantry.

Commissioned lieutenant-colonel, March 14, 1862, with rank from March 13, 1862, vice P. J. Joachimsen resigned.
